## Approval as First Aid/CPR Provider

Recently you requested approval to teach First Aid/CPR in Northwest Territories and Nunavut.

Section 1 (1) of the *General Safety Regulations* of the Northwest Territories and Nunavut provide the following definition of first aider:

"means a person who holds a certificate of qualification in standard first aid issued by the Priory of Canada of the Most Venerable Order of the Hospital of Saint John of Jerusalem, or an equivalent certificate of qualification acceptable to the Chief Safety Officer."

I completed a review of the materials provided by Lifesaving Society Alberta & Northwest Territories and the qualification required to teach the course, in comparison to what is taught by St. John Ambulance. I approve the First Aid/CPR course as it complies with the *General Safety Regulations* of the Northwest Territories and Nunavut. As Chief Safety Officer for the Northwest Territories and Nunavut, I consider Lifesaving Society Alberta & Northwest Territories an approved First Aid/CPR course and grant full equivalency of certification in this jurisdiction.
