
Safety Management Courses

Remembering Marlin Moore

Past President of The Royal Life Saving Society Canada and the World Water Safety Federation

March 30, 1937 - March 4, 2021

On March 4, 2021 Marlin Moore QC, beloved husband of Louise Marguerite Moore (nee Doiron) passed away peacefully in his sleep, following a two-year struggle with non-Hodgkins lymphoma, in his Calgary home at age 83.

Marlin served as the President of the Royal Life Saving Society Canada from 1979 to 1982, and the World Lifesaving Society from 1986 to 1988, where he met the Queen and Prince Philip at Buckingham Palace in this capacity on several occasions.

Due to Marlin's outstanding service with the Lifesaving Society, he received many notable awards over the years, including Service Medal (1963), Bar to Service Medal (1967), Service Cross (1971), Bar to Service Cross (1974), Commonwealth Honorary Life Governor (1989), and the Queens Golden Jubilee Medal (2001). He was also named an Honorary Officer of the Lifesaving Society Alberta and Northwest Territories Branch.

Not only was he a recipient of many distinguished awards, but in 2004, the Class 19 Marlin Moore National Lifeguard Award was inaugurated to commemorate the 40th anniversary of the Lifesaving Society National Lifeguard Award. Marlin was a candidate of the first ever National Lifeguard Course in 1964 and continued his support of the Society ever since. The Class 19 Marlin Moore National Lifeguard Award is presented to the affiliate member accumulating the highest point total in conducting National Lifeguard programs. He always enjoyed attending our Annual General Meeting to present this award in person as often as he could.

He will be remembered by the Alberta and Northwest Territories Branch, its board, and its members for his remarkable dedication to the Lifesaving Society and his tremendous sense of humour.

Marlin is survived by his wife Louise, his daughter Michele, his son Andre (Shira Close), his grandchildren, nieces and nephews, sisters-in-law and his many friends and acquaintances. Marlin was predeceased by his parents Lillian and Stanley Moore, his sister Donna (Ron), his brothers John (Jacy) and Gerald.

A private ceremony was recently held for close family members. A Celebration of Life will be held once Covid-19 restrictions have been lifted.
