#### January is Bathtub Safety Month!

It's freezing cold outside, and who wouldn't want to beat the chill with a nice warm bath? Well, before you get into the tub, remember that bathtubs are the #1 man-made setting where drownings occur.

The two demographics most affected by bathtub drownings remain children and seniors. There are measures that you can take to keep yourself, and your kids, safe in the bathtub:



Watch your child, not your phone! Actively supervise your child.

for weight-bearing to prevent falls.



Stay beside your child while they are in the bath. Drowning is silent and can happen in seconds.



Have someone close enough to hear you and respond, should you have a problem.



Take care getting in and out of bathtubs: use adhesive traction stickers and grab-bars designed
