## Lifeguard Trainer

The City is committed to fostering a respectful, inclusive and equitable workplace which is representative of the community we serve. Under the supervision of the Complex Coordinator, as a Lifeguard Trainer, you will be responsible for instructing and evaluating National Lifeguard candidates to Lifesaving Society standards. You will be required to adhere to the Corporate Code of Conduct. Primary duties include:

- ? Demonstrate and instruct candidates to the must see standards set out by The Lifesaving Society for the National Lifeguard Program.
- ? Provide feedback throughout the course and communicate the result of evaluation to candidates at the end of the course.
- ? Complete lesson plans, evaluations and related administrative work.
- ? Create a safe learning environment for participants.
- ? Attend training, meetings, and orientations as required.

## Qualifications

- ? Must be at least 18 years of age.
- ? Completed High School Diploma or GED and at least 3 months of experience as a lifeguard.
- ? Current Standard First Aid from an approved Alberta Occupational Health and Safety provider is required.
- ? Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED) from an approved Alberta Occupational Health and Safety provider current within 12

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months is required.

- ? National Lifeguard award (Lifesaving Society) current within 24 months is required.
- ? National Lifeguard Instructor (Lifesaving Society) current within 24 months is required.
- ? 6 months of experience in a teaching environment will be considered an asset.
- ? You are a strong communicator with demonstrated judgement, adaptability and team leadership skills.

### Pre-employment Requirements

- ? A security clearance with a Vulnerable Sector Search will be conducted.
- ? Successful applicants must provide proof of qualifications.
- ? Applicants may be contacted, interviewed, and hired throughout the duration of this competition.

**Pre-employment Drug Test:** An offer of employment for this position will be conditional on an applicant passing a [pre-employment drug test](#). This test assesses for use of drugs including cannabis. Failure to pass a pre-employment drug test may prevent an applicant from being hired into any safety sensitive position for a period of up to twelve months.
