First Aid Update

A major revision is coming to our Lifesaving First Aid program!

We'll be updating many of our resources, including:

- NEW Alberta First Aid Manual (to replace the Canadian First Aid Manual).
- NEW Instructor Delivery Guide (which will include teaching notes and activities for delivering the candidate courses).
- NEW Candidate Workbook.
- Updated Award Guides for candidate and Instructor levels.

The revision will launch in the next few months, and we'll be sure to keep you updated until then!

National Lifeguard Instructor Workshop Debrief

In Fall 2023, the Lifesaving Society hosted three very successful workshops for our National Lifeguard Instructors and Trainers! We had over 45 participants from across Alberta and the Northwest Territories, totaling over 400 years of experience!

National Lifeguard Instructors and Trainers provided input on key messages and activities for conducting successful National Lifeguard courses, and strategies for supporting lifeguards and instructors.

This information will be put to use in late 2024/early 2025 when we begin revising our provincial resources for the National Lifeguard program.

We're incredibly grateful to all National Lifeguard Instructors and Trainers who attended and provided us with feedback, and we hope to host more Instructor streams going forward!

Lifejacket Loaner Stations

We want to ensure that individuals across Alberta and the Northwest Territories have free and easy access to lifejackets through our Lifejacket Loaner Stations program. We're working hard to revitalize this program by opening new stations and restocking existing ones.

If you have old lifejackets that are still in working condition, please consider donating them to us! We distribute these lifejackets free of charge to the program, and they are especially helpful to communities starting a new station. Since the pandemic, lifejackets have been very expensive and difficult to procure, so every little bit helps.

Of course, if you do not have lifejackets available, we also accept monetary donations.



Host Your Own Water Smart Event

We are continually working to get out into the community to share our drowning prevention messages, and we'd love to help you host a Water Smart event of your own!

Some events we have been booked for include:

- Community events
- Work education days
- · Long weekend events at waterfronts

If you are planning a National Drowning Prevention Week or World Drowning Prevention Day event in your community, and you would like a member of our staff to speak about water safety topics and programs, please keep us in mind.

We're already starting to book into the summer, so the earlier you send in a request, the better!



Ice Safety

As you know, we've been experiencing a warmer than usual winter here in Alberta, and across all of Canada. According to a research article in PLoS ONE, there has been an increase in winter drownings in ice-covered regions experiencing warmer winters.

Our partner, the Drowning Prevention Research Centre, states that ice-related incidents account for about 6% of all water-related deaths in Canada. This past December, there were 4 ice-related drownings in Alberta alone.

With these statistics in mind, please make sure to remember these ice safety tips:

1. Never Go Alone

It's important to have a buddy with you when you go out on the ice, so that they can call for help if things go wrong.

2. Wear a Lifejacket Over Your Snow Suit

You may feel silly wearing a lifejacket on the ice, but if the ice were to break, a lifejacket can increase your chances of survival, and may literally save your life. A lifejacket can also serve as an extra layer to keep you warm.

3. Be Prepared

Before going out onto the ice, make sure you take ice safety equipment with you, such as ice picks, a throwing rope, a first aid kit, a pocketknife, and a cell phone. If you're traveling far, ensure you have waterproof matches, a fire starter, and something to burn to help combat hypothermia should you fall through the ice. If you're travelling in a vehicle, make sure you have an escape plan should the vehicle go through the ice.

4. Use Designated Ice Surfaces

As it can be difficult to tell how safe an ice surface is just by looking at it, we recommend sticking to designated ice surfaces, such as public skating rinks, where the ice is regularly tested for thickness and stability.
